# SANDUSKY COUNTY 4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

Sandusky County 4H empowers youth with the skills they need to lead for a lifetime! 4-H inspires curiosity, builds lifelong skills, fuels adventures, and grows leaders through fun, hands-on activities, that include clubs, projects, service, and camps. There have been many young leaders who have been impacted by their experience with 4-H.

#### **SUCCESS STORY**

Robert was a member of the Sandusky County 4-H Program for 11 years where he was active in both club and county-wide programming. He took on a variety of projects, but his favorites included woodworking, welding and small engines. He decided early in life that he was interested in a career where he could "work with his hands" and explored as many career areas as possible through 4-H projects, school programming and other youth organizations. As a now young adult, Robert is happily employed as a mechanic and is looking forward to being awarded his journeyman's card soon. He says that the 4-H experiences he had helped him not only explore career areas but also learn more about working with others, taking responsibility for yourself and working until the job is done.







# ACE MENTORING PROGRAM

ACE (Assisting Children to Excel)
Mentoring is a school based, career
mentoring program at Fremont Middle
School and Fremont Ross High School.
The program is designed to help students
academically and offers them another
caring adult as a support system.





#### **SUCCESS STORY**

Alex is an only child and being raised by his paternal grandparents. The only relationship Alex was comfortable with was the one at home which consisted of grandparents, both over the age of 60. When he was referred to ACE Mentoring, he had no desire to be matched and was resistant. However, his grandparents continued to stress to him the importance of developing relationships outside of their home.

Due to COVID, at home learning was the right choice for Alex for the majority of 2022. When school resumed, Alex decided to reach out and submit his application for an ACE mentor. He was matched with his mentor, Ricky, by the end of that week..

Ricky has been an ACE Mentor for approximately four years and has many of the same interests as Alex. The situation of his mentee and the reason for referral was explained to Ricky and he was enthusiastic and up for the challenge.

Alex's referral to ACE Mentoring was not based on concerns of attendance, behavior or grades, but to build a rapport with other adults. Ricky helped Alex to open up, be excited and look forward to their mentoring session. This helped Alex increase his social and communication skills, and to trust someone other than his grandparents. Ricky listens and allows Alex to have a voice. Both feel respected by one another and look forward to continuing to learn as they build their relationship.

SENIOR MEALS
DELIVERED





Great Lakes Community Action Partnership provides healthy home-delivered meals daily Monday through Thursday, which meet and exceed government guidelines for senior nutrition, to homebound seniors in Sandusky County. The program's home-delivered, nutritious meals serve as a vital nutritional life-line. A licensed Social Worker conducts an in-home Nutrition Risk Analysis based on a senior's current eating habits, which aids GLCAP in determining eligibility for the program. A healthy diet for seniors can prolong life expectancy, raise quality of life, and allows seniors to age in their own homes.

#### **SUCCESS STORY**

Norma is a wife, mother, grandmother, great-grandmother and chief cook and caregiver for her husband. She began to have difficulty cooking a whole balanced meal and could not keep up with the nutritional needs of her husband. Encouraged by her adult children she accepted Meals on Wheels for her husband, but she would not accept meals for herself. Like so many other seniors she did not want to lose her independence, and let go of the cook role that helped define her. This went on for about a year.

Finally, Norma was encouraged by the Meals on Wheels daily delivery driver to receive a meal herself. She trusted him. Norma now says that Meals on Wheels has been a true blessing. She is happy that they are both receiving healthy meals five days a week and that she is still able to maintain her independence at home. They both gave kudos to the GLCAP Nutrition Coordinator for making the meals so well rounded and healthy. They are very appreciative of the whole team and all that GLCAP does for the Seniors of Sandusky County.

#### **SUCCESS STORY**

CASA was appointed to a 1½ year old little girl, who was living in a home with her mother who was using drugs while caring for her. When Children Services intervened, she was removed from the home and placed with her aunt. While in her aunt's care, this little girl was abused and left with unsafe caregivers. She was once again removed and this time placed in a foster home until a better suited family member could be located.

She was very shy and scared. It took a long time before she would warm up to new people, especially men. However, once this little girl was placed with a new family, she showed significant improvement. Who was once a shy, guarded little girl turned into a very playful, smiley child. Her speech improved and she was starting to put words together to form short sentences towards the end of CASA's work. She was always so excited to see her CASA advocate, who was a very tall man with tremendous patience. He worked hard to build a rapport with the 2-year-old.

Her mom was in and out of jail throughout this case, and when she wasn't in jail, she was checking herself in and out of rehabilitation facilities. Her mom tried to regain custody. However, she knew that wasn't likely so she tried to get the girl placed with her significant other and other family members that were not appropriate placement options. The mother thought these people could just "give her back" after the case was closed.

The CASA advocate fought really hard to make sure that this little girl didn't get placed back with her mom to only get moved again. She was thriving in her current placement and any changes to that would have only set her back. The court took the advocate's recommendation into consideration and placed this child in the legal custody of the family members that she had been living with. There she will continue to thrive and be in a stable and safe situation for the duration of her childhood.
